

# How to Format an MLA Paper and Works Cited Page

## MLA Paper Formatting

1. Create ID tag in top left corner with first and last name, course prefix and number, instructor's name, and date paper is due in day-month-year format.

*Example:*

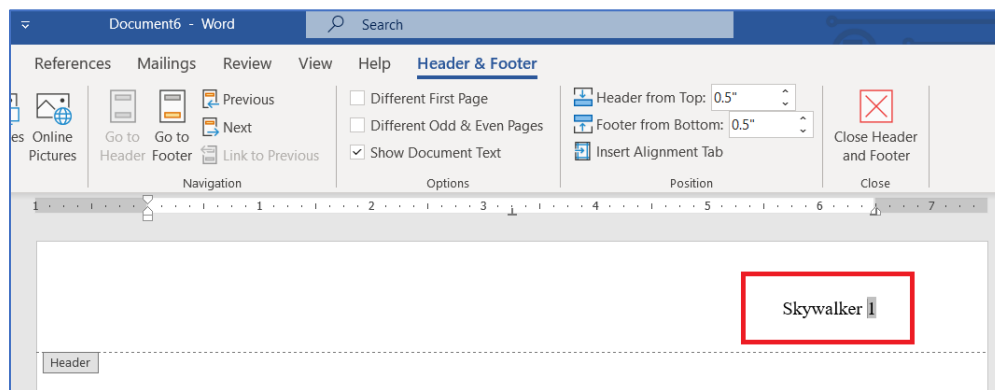
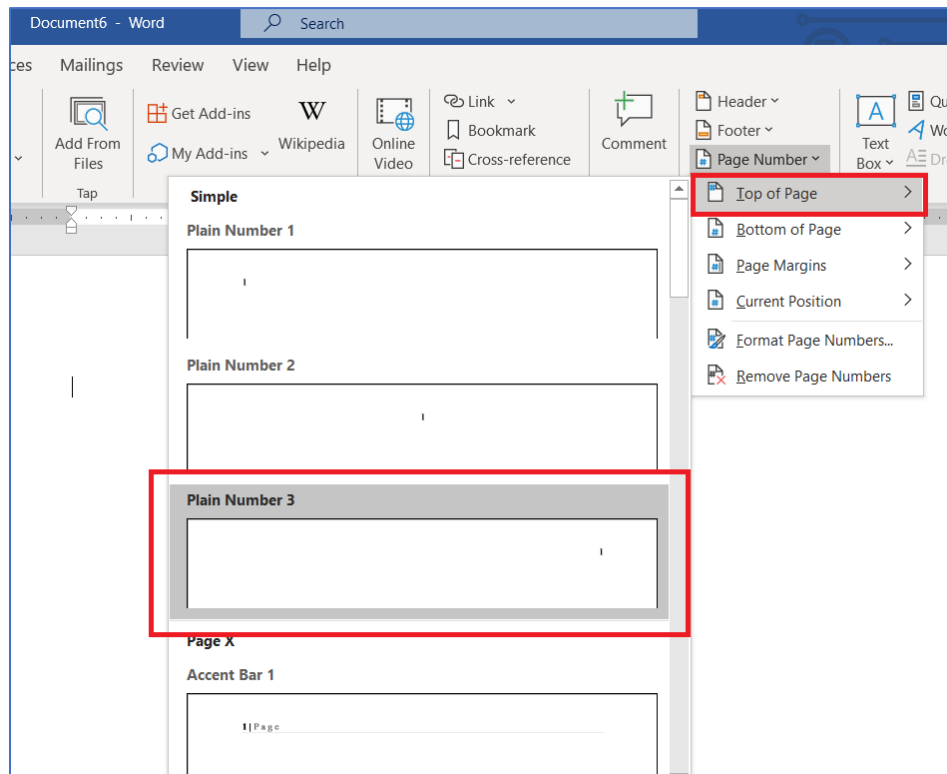
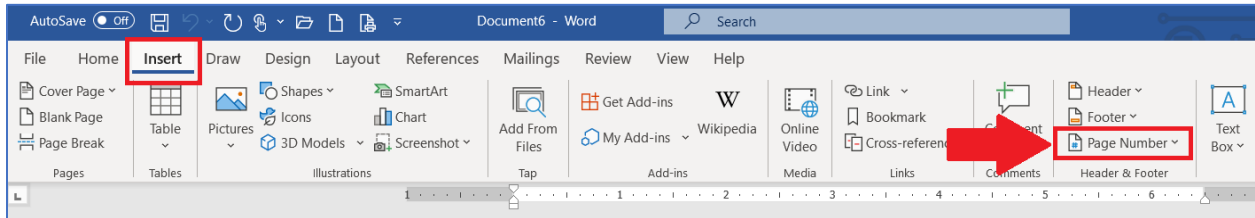
2. Times New Roman 12-point font for all text

3. ALL text is double spaced with no extra line spaces between paragraphs



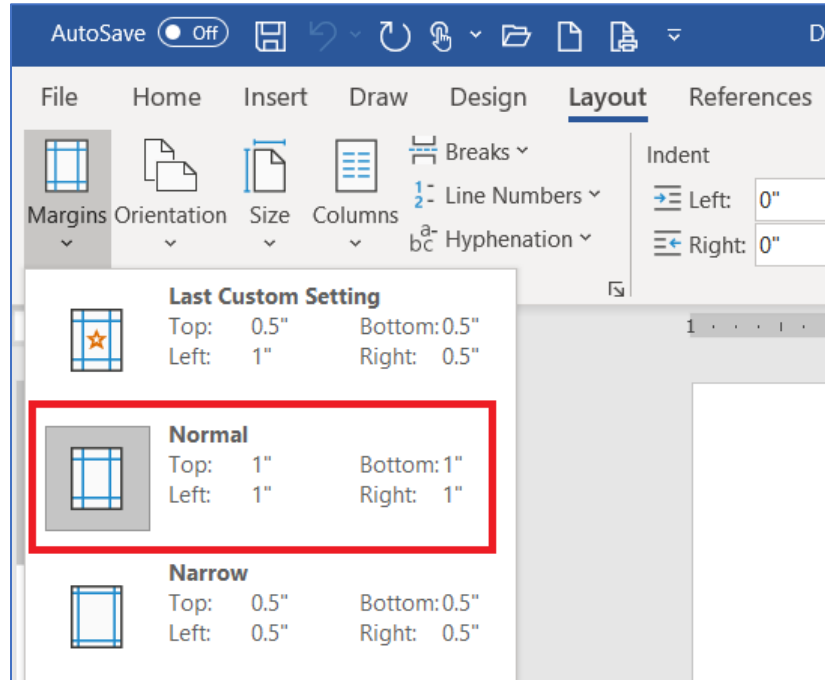
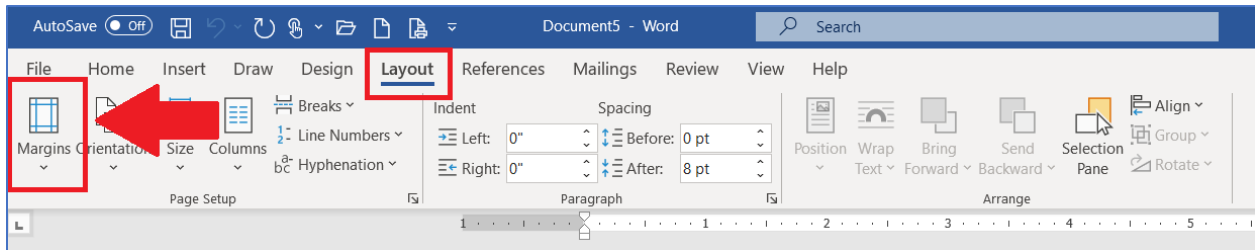
# How to Format an MLA Paper and Works Cited Page

4. Center essay title and Works Cited title (no bold or underline)
5. Indent the beginning of each body paragraph by using the Tab key (on your keyboard) once
6. Include a page number header in upper right-hand corner of each page, then add your last name in front of the page number.



# How to Format an MLA Paper and Works Cited Page

## 7. 1-inch margins all around: top, bottom, left, right



## Complete example:

Insert "page number" named "plain number 3" and type your last name in front of it to create the header. → Skywalker 1

Centered Paper Title ← Center the paper's title and keep the double-spaced formatting consistent throughout the entire paper body.

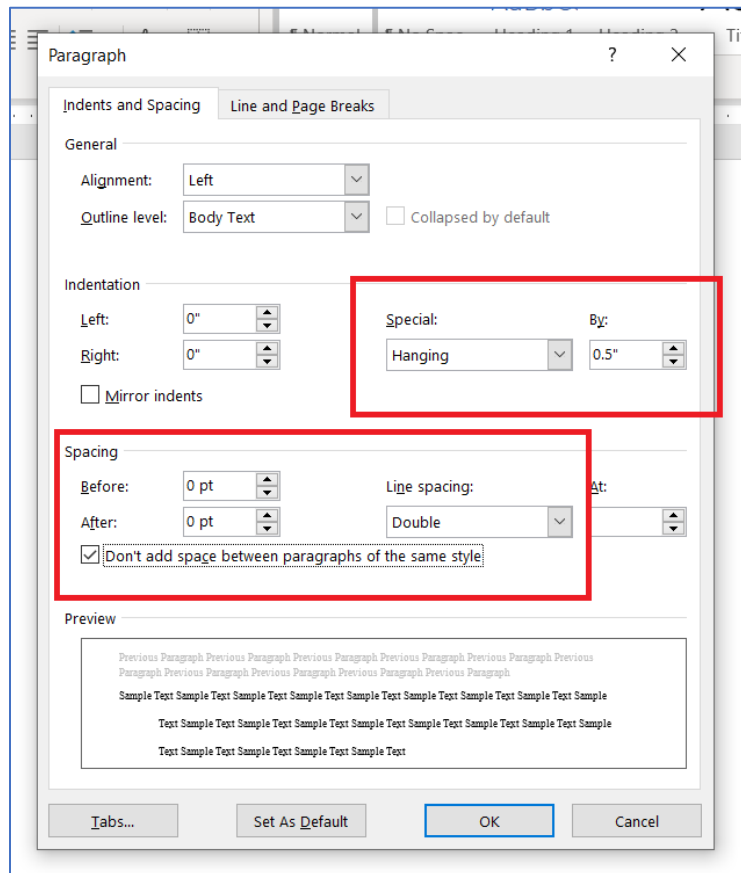
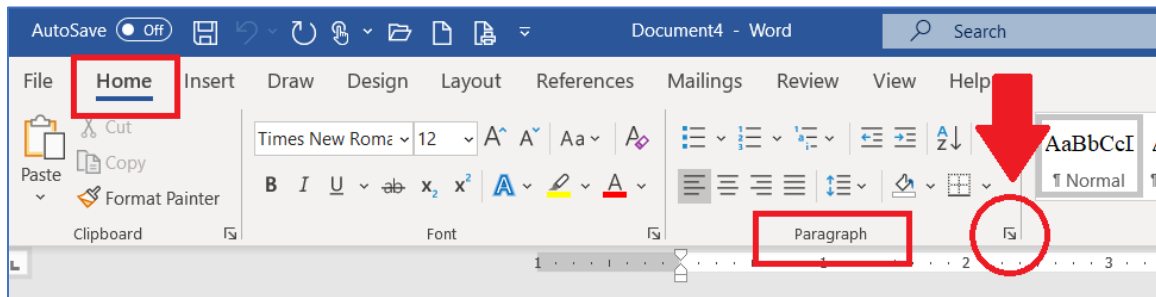

# How to Format an MLA Paper and Works Cited Page

## Formatting Works Cited Page

1. Works Cited is entitled Works Cited (not Bibliography or References because the citations have been cited in your essay)
2. Use hanging indent for Works Cited entries (not the centered title)



3. Works Cited begins at the beginning of a new page after essay is finished
4. Alphabetize Works Cited entries
